Job Description

NEP Canada ULC is looking for a Pipeline Integrity Coordinator (PIC). This role will be based in the Devon/Leduc, Alberta operating area and will report to the Operations Superintendent as well as the Pipeline Integrity Engineer. The PIC will be responsible for working with the Pipeline Integrity Engineer, Field Operators, and 3rd party chemical, pigging, and cathodic vendors to ensure NEP Canada's pipeline integrity programs are effectively and efficiently maintained. Additional responsibilities will also include pipeline commissioning, pig scheduling/tracking, attending and managing first call activities, managing line locating activities and leak surveys. The successful candidate will be responsible, dependable, honest, self-motivated, and aim to contribute to a winning team. NEP's field positions require individuals who are able to work in a physically demanding environment. Candidates must live within 45 min of Leduc/Devon, have 5+ years of relevant industry experience within the pipeline integrity field and formal operational and safety training.

Primary Responsibilities

- Must be proficient in corrosion control and pipeline integrity methods and technologies.
- Maintain and ensure the field practices adhere to the corporate Pipeline Operations and Maintenance Manual (POMM)
- Working with 3rd party line locators and attending and managing first call activities on NEP Canada's behalf.
- Manage pipeline change of status activities such as discontinuations and abandonments and ensuring the proper documentation is completed.
- Assist with pipeline commissioning activities.
- Capable of supervising 3rd party vendors and suppliers
- Responsible for a variety of tasks involved in analyzing, advanced troubleshooting, testing, monitoring, maintaining, installing, repairing, maintenance, etc.
- Actively manage and continuously improve the Integrity Management Plans, which include chemical inhibition, cathodic protection, pigging, depth of cover, geohazards, inline inspection, pipeline repair, pipeline replacement etc.
- Respond to call-out situations and may be required to perform additional duties due to operational upsets, construction projects, emergency response or other unforeseen circumstances.
- Must perform all duties in a safe manner consistent with company procedures and policies and responsible for training.

Minimum Education/Experience Requirements

- High School diploma or equivalent including 5 years' experience in corrosion control supporting pipeline integrity projects.
- NACE certified CP level 1 required
- Technical knowledge for the application and maintenance of external & internal corrosion control.
- Have a working knowledge of measurement, mechanical and electrical/electronic activities as it is related to the corrosion control duties.
- Excellent verbal & written communications skills and be capable of effectively interfacing with all levels of management, field personnel, and professionals.
- Must be able to use sound judgment, be a self-starter and well organized.
- Detailed knowledge of pipeline operations, API, DOT procedures and HES.
- Proficiency utilizing MS Applications.

Preferred Education/Experience

- Technical diploma, Associate or Bachelor's degree.
- Prefer 3-5 years' experience. NACE certified CP Level 1 or greater, and NACE Internal Corrosion for Pipelines - Basic.
- Practical experience in pipeline integrity projects such as in-line inspection, hydro testing, and direct assessment methods, an asset.
